WILL WE EVER LEARN THE LESSONS ABOUT GENOCIDE?

The 1948 Genocide Act defines genocide as an attempt to destroy a people, as a whole or in part, on the basis of their ethnicity, faith or other forms of identity. Yet regimes continue to act with impunity, slaughtering their own citizens, and enlisting civilians to participate in massive human rights abuses against their neighbours.

April 2013 will mark ten years since the start of the genocide that has devastated Darfur in Sudan, leaving at least 300,000 dead and millions living in refugee camps.

Alyth Reform Synagogue is inviting you to a special event on April 11<sup>th</sup> 2013 as part of A Decade of Darfur events, marking ten years since the start of the slaughter in a remote area of western Sudan.

**NEVER AGAIN? WILL WE EVER LEARN THE LESSONS ABOUT GENOCIDE?**

The evening will include a panel discussion about why we have failed to learn the lessons of the 20th century’s genocides, with survivors from the Holocaust, Bosnia, Rwanda and Sudan.

The keynote for the evening will be by **Mukesh Kapila**, former UN Resident and Humanitarian Coordinator for the Sudan and the whistle blower for Darfur. **Mukesh** is also the Special Representative for the Aegis Trust.

On display will be drawings by Darfuri children in refugee camps, depicting their experiences of the ethnic cleansing that continues in a virtual media vacuum to this day. The pictures have been accepted by the International Criminal Court in The Hague as contextual evidence of genocide, war crimes and crimes against humanity in Sudan. Leading members of the regime, including the president, Field Marshall Bashir, have been indicted for these crimes but remain at liberty.
